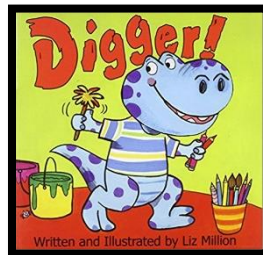

The Big Survey

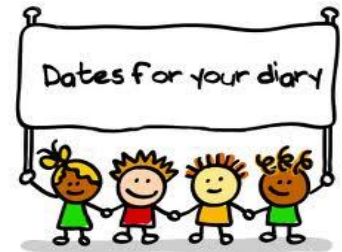

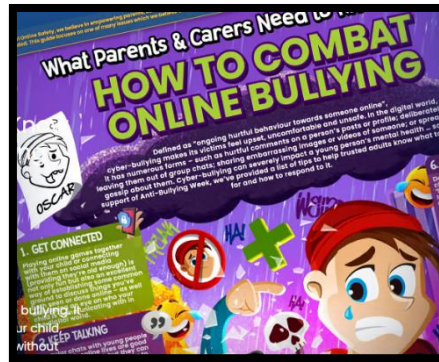

Online Safety:

As a parent, one of the most worrying things for me is Online bullying, It's a whole new world to navigate since I was a child. Defined as "ongoing hurtful behaviour towards someone online", cyber-bullying makes its victims feel upset, uncomfortable and unsafe. In the digital world, it has numerous forms – such as hurtful comments on a person's posts or profile; deliberately leaving them out of group chats; sharing embarrassing images or videos of someone; or spreading gossip about them. Cyber-bullying can severely impact a young person's mental health ... so, in support of Anti-Bullying Week, National Online Safety have provided a list of tips to help trusted adults know what to look for and how to respond to it.
