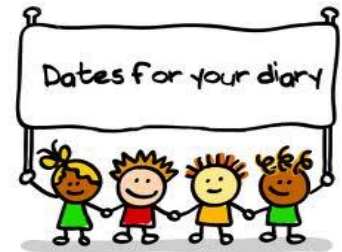
Our Library
