

Worried about a child out of school hours?



called self-regulation: this is when children start to become capable of exercising more control over their impulses and behaviour, and managing their own emotions.

This vital developmental milestone, however, isn't reached spontaneously. Learning to self-regulate requires sensitive guidance from trusted adults – simply talking with children about their thoughts and feelings, for instance, can ease the route to

self-regulation. This week's #WakeUpWednesday guide has some expert tips for supporting children to reach this goal.

- If a child is in immediate danger or at risk of immediate harm, you should contact the Police on 999.
- If you are concerned about a child you should share your concern with the First Contact Team on 03000 267 979.
