

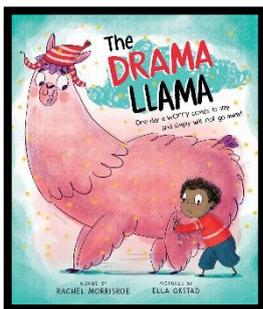


# Sunnybrow News

Once we get the money totalled up, we will use it to buy some lovely resources to support positive playtimes. It has been another day to feel proud in Sunnybrow!

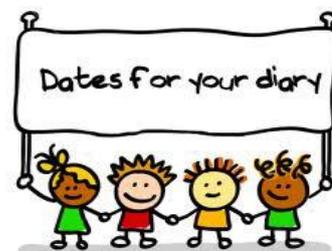
